



Hi, all! :-)

I figured it was about time I provided another update. And, the bottom line is that nothing has changed yet ... Hughes has still not finalized the mobile program. I suspect that when Hughes does make a decision on the mobile program, it will happen with little or no warning.

The good news about this is that until they finalize the mobile program, you can buy the equipment for the lower residential/consumer cost and be fully mobile now! You will also pay the lower residential monthly service fees for now ... and, those fees will be reduced by either \$10 or \$20 a month for 3 months (Spaceway 3 satellite) or 2 years (Jupiter 1 satellite).

Currently, your cost for the satellite VSAT system and "standard installation" (remember ... most within Hughes still do not recognize mobile) is only \$250. If you order, Hughes will charge you that amount plus the first month of service at the time the order is placed.

Any mobility items you need (i.e., tripod, meter, cables) will not be charged by MobileInternetSatellite.com until either you pick them up or they have been shipped to you.
